Key Drivers for Skills for Life	Asset Skills is the lead SSC for adult literacy, language and numeracy and works across the Skills for Business network to support the development of this agenda. Asset Skills is also the lead on Functional English, part of the functional skills suite, including Maths and ICT, which will come on stream from September 2008 to reflect the White Papers (14-19 and Skills). The main focus of activity is on Cleaning and Housing sectors, where a high level of need has been identified. The primary aim is to increase the awareness of the benefits to employers of investing in improving the literacy and numeracy skills of employees. In particular, projects have been developed to support frontline staff, supervisors and line managers to recognise adult literacy and numeracy needs in the workplace and signpost to provision. High proportion of workers with ESOL needs, especially in the cleaning sector, linked to effective induction and development programmes. This will take on added significance in the run up to the Olympics. Asset Skills have developed a Pathway Card to record training and achievement of workers in a sector where there is a substantial churn rate.
